## Curriculum

You will find an outline of the $4^{\text {th }}$ grade math curriculum on my website.
We use the $4^{\text {th }}$ grade CA standard based Singapore math books. This year we will be using the 4A and 4B textbooks and workbooks. The 4A books will be handed out at the beginning of the year; the 4B books will be handed out around mid-year.

## Independent Practice/Homework

Homework in math is assigned nightly including some weekends,, and students are expected to show their work, unless otherwise instructed. Homework often consists of workbook or practice pages along with corrections from the prior night's assignment. Corrections are a required part of nightly homework.

Homework assignments are due at the start of the next school day (by 8:30 a.m.). Corrections are noted by a tab in the workbook. Extra credit is not available as students are kept busy with homework and corrections.

## Tests \& Drills

Computation drills are given once a week, often Thursdays but check the weekly homework schedule.. Practice drills can be found on my website. The goal of these drills is to keep up computation skills so that students have the basic math facts memorized to automaticity.

Tests will be taken usually once a week. Check the weekly homework schedule for test dates.
Graded tests will be recorded on Gradelink.
